Commodore's Comments - Death By GPS

Many of you know that navigation has been a vocation and an avocation for me over many years as both a naval officer and sailor. The other day my curiosity was peaked when a TV news reporter did a follow-up titled "Death by GPS", on the story of a woman who survived for seven weeks in a stranded van in the wilds of Nevada. Luckily she was found by hunters, but her husband, who set off to find help

three days into the ordeal, has not been found and is presumed dead. The couple was traveling to Las Vegas using GPS to guide them on Nevada back roads when the road GPS told them to follow became impassable. The lesson here for those of us who sail with GPS and chart plotters is that the technology is not infallible.

As reliable as the system is, GPS has outages, positional errors, and the radio frequency signal can be blocked out. In a paper published not long ago, a British expert noted that the typical satellite signal is about as powerful as one automobile headlight, and that signal power is spread over about half the earth. The trees along North Shore block the weak signal often as I drive to Annette and Mike's home, and I've lost GPS signal many times in heavy rain squalls on the Bay (just when you need it most!). Right now there is an ongoing battle between GPS users and the FCC over a request by broadband supplier LightSquared's application to operate powerful internet stations on frequencies next to those used by GPS. These signals are said to have the potential of blocking GPS in a large area around the LightSquared stations.

MORGAN JR., HENRY STURGIS. Henry Morgan was born in 1924 in Oyster Bay, NY. He was graduated from Groton in 1942 and from Harvard in 1944. He entered the US Navy in 1942 and was commissioned in 1944. He commanded a submarine, a division of submarines, a submarine tender, and a missile cruiser. He subsequently served as naval commander for the United Nations Command in Korea and as senior member of the Korean armistice commission at Panmunjom. After retiring as Rear Admiral in 1975, he attended George Washington University Law School and

practiced Admiralty Law in Houston, TX from 1978-1990. He retired and moved to Gibson Island, MD in 1990 and then to Annapolis, MD in 2001. He began sailing in 1930, cruising in 1938, sailing offshore in 1955; and he was still racing and coaching the Naval Academy Offshore Sailing Team up until his death. He died after a brief bout of pneumonia May 6, 2011. He was a MRSA member for just a couple of years, but participated in the Wednesday Nights as a GIYC member for a long time on his J/27 Dash.

He is survived by his wife of 38 years, Alexandra McCain Morgan, 7 children and 10 grandchildren. Donations may be given to Naval Academy Sailing Foundation, Inc. Canoe/Kayak Trip to Pocomoke River - Saturday, June 4th - Event May Be Cancelled - call before you go

The sails seem to be missing on these boats, but all the fun is still there. On Saturday, June 4th, MRSA members will trek to the Pocomoke River for a day of splashing pleasure. Canoes and double kayaks are \$45/boat, and solo kayaks are \$40/boat. For those interested in bringing their own boats, the Pocomoke River Canoe Company will portage boats for \$10 each. The company supplies the boats, paddles, and life jackets. You may wish to bring a cushion to sit on, and, as always, weather-appropriate clothing. It takes approximately 2 ½ hours to get to the Pocomoke River Canoe Company, at 2 River Street in Snow Hill, Maryland, so leave early for a 10:30 arrival. Everyone should bring their own lunch including drink), and we will stop for lunch while on the water. The trip itself will take about 2 ½ to 3 ½ hours.

<u>Driving directions</u> (although you may want to consult your map or GPS for more detailed instructions): Take US-50 E until it becomes US-13 S/SALISBURY bypass. Go 2.9 miles and take the MD-12 ramp toward SALISBURY/SNOW HILL. Turn LEFT onto MD-12 S (If you reach US-13 S you've gone about 0.1 miles too far). Go about 15 miles. (If you reach MD-113, you've gone too far). Turn RIGHT onto RIVER Street. RIVER Street is 0.5 miles past HOPKINS Lane.
