# The Fourth of July Cruise Brought More Fireworks Than Expected

Fourth of July weekend found holiday revelers, *Frequent Flyer*, *Betelgeux*, *Light Spray*, *Min Van IV*, *Renaissance* (by way of Kent Island), *Ravenous*, and *Flying Low*, heading from the Magothy to the Choptank with light winds out of the south and summer temperatures. It was a motorsail, but anytime on the water is enjoyable and that we did. The anchorage for Saturday was Waterhole Cove off the thriving metropolis of Sherwood. A close inspection of the water indicated it was safe to swim with no sea nettles sighted. After a refreshing swim Happy Hour was commenced aboard *Renaissance*. The hors de vors rivaled a buffet at the finest restaurant with everyone returning to their boats with little need to haul-out the grill and cook dinner. An unexpected treat was the St. Michael's fireworks which appeared over the eastern horizon. The air cooled and a shower passed during the night.

At 0900 sharp the "potluck" began as everyone arrived aboard Flying Low for a breakfast comparable to "Buddy's" on a Sunday morning. We do like to eat!! Anchors were then pulled and everyone headed for Plaindealing Creek. There was a favorable wind, so some gas was saved by sailing. We met Merlin, Dulcinea, and Royale Salute in Plaindealing Creek. After a lazy afternoon of reading, boat chores, and swimming all except for the crew of Betegeux, headed to Oxford for dinner at Schooners Landing and the Robert Morris Inn. Three dingys left from the anchorage for Schooners Landing where we met Rich and Toni Hughes, and Dick Kamman's brother and sister-in-law, Bob and Jenna. There was a forecast for storms much later in the evening, but the crews felt confident that we could easily have dinner and watch the fireworks before the weather would hit. Service was a bit slow, so by 7 o'clock we were waiting for dinner when John Mullarky called (his crew elected to dine aboard) to warn us a storm was imminent and he could hear thunder in the distance. Annette and Mike Mullarky, thankfully, traveled to the anchored boats to close hatches, take in laundry and secure the cockpits. With multiple i-phones giving the radar reports dinner was taken "to go". As the diners gathered their dinners, (this took a while), the storm approached rapidly. Skies grew darker and the winds increased. Two dingys left for the anchorage, while one elected to wait-out the storm. The crossing was a bit bumpy and WET, but not too bad. As we approached something did not appear right! Frequent Flyer had traveled across the creek without hitting any other boats, and rested on a shoal. With quick thinking and exceptional seamanship skills Debbie Lund and Mike Mullarky boarded her, got her off the shoal, and motored over to Betelgeux where she was securely rafted-up. Mike and Loura Bonham and Peggy Poe had waited-out the storm in Oxford. The cause of Frequent Flyer's independent journey was a separation of the anchor from the chain.

After receiving phone calls about the plight of *Frequent Flyer*, the Bonhams and Peggy were provided with the latest in raingear (see photo) and valiantly crossed the Tred Avon to find *Frequent Flyer* safely nestled with *Betelgeux*. It rained a bit more and the wind certainly continued. Amazingly, the Oxford fireworks materialized late in the southeastern sky with quite a display. Many thanks to Jon, Mike, Annette and Debbie for saving the day!!

After the events of the previous evening, WIND, and the promise of strong storms in the afternoon the anchorage was clear of MRSA boats early. Rounding Walnut Point found favorable winds and a delightful sail to the Bay Bridge. Lora Bonham said it best, "It is so nice to sail with such caring and kind people." Thank you to everyone who gave support and made this a memorable weekend.

#### **BAY RACING IN JULY**

**The Annual Race to Baltimore** was held on Saturday, July 9. The start at the Baltimore Light featured 49 boats, including 12 Magothy-based boats. Four PHRF classes, a J-35 One Design fleet and a multihull fleet participated in the race, which was to end near the Inner Harbor but was shortened due to wind conditions. The J-35 One Design Class was won by MRSA's Mike Mullarky and the crew of "Eighth Deadly Sin". The Non Spin Class was won by MRSA's Mark and Marty Walker and the crew of "Bumble Bee".

The Corsica River Races (Over and Back) both fell victim to the heat wave which scorched the bay area during the weekend of July 23 and 24. A promising list of entries quickly dwindled as the dire weekend weather forecast prompted skippers to withdraw their boats from competition. Only two boats ("Eighth Deadly Sin" and "My Way") crossed the starting line Saturday morning and close-reached toward Love Point where the high temperatures were joined with a dying wind, ending the race far short of the finish line near the mouth of the Corsica River. The Corsica River Yacht Club held a good party anyway with an Eastern Shore barbeque dinner and a Bluegrass band at their beautiful grounds on the shores on the Corsica.
