# Annapolis Parade of Lights

Commencing at about sunset (1644) on Saturday, December 8, the crew will begin gathering at the Annapolis Marriott (room 520) on the waterfront to OOH and AAH at the Annual Parade of Lights. If you have not been to the parade, or have not brought your children and friends to this event, this year would be an excellent time to start! The creativity of the lights on dozens of boats parading in the harbor is something spectacular to see. And MRSA has been doing this room thing at the Marriott long enough that our room is in one of the most prime locations in the building. (And if it were not, you could probably "crash" one of the other group rooms anyway.) Please bring a finger-snack to share; drinks will be provided by MRSA. The parade will begin with the sounding of a gun (or something) at *precisely* 1800 (also known as 6 PM for your landlubber guests).
