I brought this salad to the June Picnic, which was a delightful event, at the Poulsen's lovely home. Many people asked me for the recipe, so, here it is.

WATERMELON SALAD

Serves 4 people

Vinaigrette:

1/4 cup each, freshly squeezed orange juice, and lemon juice zest of 1 orange, & 1 lemon
1/4 cup minced shallots or vidalia onion
1 Tablespoon honey or to taste
2 Tablespoons balsamic vinegar
1/2 cup good olive oil
salt & pepper to taste

6 cups baby arugula

1/8th seedless watermelon, rind removed, cut in 1-inch cubes

12 ounces good Greek feta cheese, 1/2-inch dice

1/2 cup fresh mint leaves, julienned

Toasted pine nuts

Whisk together all vinaigrette ingredients. Place in refrigerator. Best made at least one day in advance.

Place greens, watermelon, feta, mint in bowl. Drizzle vinaigrette and toss. Scatter pine nuts on top. You will have extra vinaigrette.
