TIPS AND TRICKS: Refrigeration



You can spend a lot of money building a 12 volt refrigeration system and the electrical charging system to support it, either solar, wind, or generator, but the average Bay sailor does a long weekend at best and is usually near a marina.

Block ice is key to longevity and versatility. Make block ice at home by taking used 2 liter soda bottles, and cutting off the tapered portion. They will last longer in today's "super coolers" which "yet" I will not mention due to brand promotion issues! Most are fine and will last a good 4 days.

Fill your super cooler only with back up ice. Worse comes to worst you buy a block of ice to carry you over. Also any ice chests exposed to the sun should be covered with a light covered vinyl sheet. On a hot summer day you will be one cool dude on the hook or under way. *Alan Weiss, Endless Summer*
